Welcome to the 2020 edition of our Newsletter. Our charity is 29 years running this year! We would like to take this opportunity to thank you most sincerely for your continued support of our charity. It has been a very busy and difficult year with the COVID-19 Pandemic arriving in early March. The COVID-19 has massive implications on our charity.

We had to cancel all our food collections in shops, schools and churches. We removed all our biro boxes, cancelled our clothes sale and every fundraising event that was planned had to be cancelled. Our shoe boxes had to be cancelled, Our overseas Humanitarian aid has been put on hold. However, we have done everything we can to help those in need. Our food Aid deliveries continue in Dublin and Limerick. We sent funding to Albania to help with the COVID-19 and to help those who are still in emergency tents following the earthquake in December. Heart To Hand is a small charity and survives only on the generosity of all our friends and supporters.

**Funding** for 2020/2021 is going to be very important for the survival of the charity. We have no paid staff, we are all volunteers. We receive no funding from the government. Every euro that is raised goes to helping the poor. If you would like to help with the day to day running costs we would love to hear from you.

# Massive Earthquake in Albania killing 51 People in December 2019.









DURRES, Albania: A powerful earthquake that killed 51 people, and buried more victims of the disaster including toddler twins and their mother.

The 6.4-magnitude quake, the country's worst ever, struck on Tuesday, centred 30 km west of the capital Tirana. It was felt across the Balkans and in the southern Italian region of Puglia, on the other side of the Adriatic Sea from Albania.

There have been hundreds of aftershocks, some with a magnitude of more than 5.0, rocking already damaged buildings and terrifying residents.

On Saturday, rescuers called a halt to efforts to find survivors in the rubble. At the Mira Mare hotel, on the Adriatic seafront in the city of Durres, a mechanized digger had ground to a halt near the ruins of concrete slabs, water boilers, mattresses and curtains from the six-story building.

"No other bodies were found at the Mira Mare," a government spokesman said.

Survivors were given shelter in a local stadium where tents were erected. Unfortunately for some they are still there. COVID-19 has stopped any progress and having lost everything including their home they have nowhere to go. Heart To Hand sent out 2 loads of humanitarian aid days after the earthquake but they need much more help.



# **Building Projects 2019/2020**





#### **Down Syndrome Tipperary Branch.**

We have recently started a renovation project for Down Syndrome Tipperary in Thurles, following their recent purchase of a House and 2 workshops. We plan to help and support the renovation of the 2 workshops, existing house and side extension to bring them up to todays standards. This will involve new insulated roofing, insulated floors, new windows, doors, electrics, plumbing and garden works. We are delighted to be able to assist with this project and we really look forward to the finished building in Jan 2021. The staff and volunteers do amazing work. Below is an extract from their website. Full details will be in next years edition.

"Down syndrome Ireland Tipperary branch is run on a voluntary basis by parents and families of children/adults with Down syndrome. We offer a wide range of services including Parentlink, a group of parents who have received training to be a first point of contact to new parents, and families. We employ a senior Speech and Language therapist, Susanna Stokes, two days a week to work with our members. Susanna gives a home programme for parents to follow at home. We also provide music therapy/Kindergym for our younger members and a Therapeutic Fitness Instructor works with our over six year olds".







#### A look back at some of our construction projects over the past 26 years.

Although established in 1991, Heart To Hand didn't start on charity builds until 1994 when a lorry full of building materials left Scarnagh to make the long journey to Albania. Our first construction project was to build a church in the Northern town of Dukagjin in Albania. At the time Albania had been rocked by years of communism and deprived of any help from the outside world until 1991 when the communism era was ended.

There was a request to build a church in Dukagjin Albania, as all churches were closed and most were destroyed during the troubled years. Heart to Hand agreed and so a plan was put in place to get all the materials required and have them transported to Albania. This was no easy feat as the roads in northern Albania were not fit for articulated lorries and the journey up there from the boat was very daunting. There was little or no tarmac and with heavy rain the conditions often became impassable. This did not stop haulier Kieran Byrne and the consignment made it all the way.

With the materials safely delivered work commenced on the beautiful church. It was an old stone building which needed a complete restoration. Lots of the arches had collapsed and had to be modelled. A new roof was required along with doors and windows. Kieran was on hand to ensure the build was up to standard and that everything Heart To Hand put their name to would be a quality building.

Above you can see the amazing arches which were reconstructed . The arch windows were modelled and set and the building took shape. Following weeks of hard work the building started to reach completion. This was a massive undertaking by the locals and one that would never have been completed without the supply of material and tradesmen from Heart To Hand. This project was the start of a long and wonderful relationship with the people of Albania. Heart To Hand continue to send materials and tradesmen and women to Albania . Concrete was a fast and accessible way of putting a roof on a house, however it offered no insulation and eventually let water through into the family homes.

The fastest solution was to cover the roof with torch on felt which we transported over from Ireland.

## A look back at some of our previous building projects in Romania & Ecuador.



In **2006** we built our first Church in Uzena outside Tirana. This building is used for all ceremonies, children's activities, teaching and much more. Its kept in excellent condition and we often visit when we are in the area.






In **2007** we headed to Babrru Albania where we built our second church . A second team travelled to Lac to build a second storey on the above school and feeding station.

In **2009** we travelled to Shkoder to construct this school and church for a small parish. We carried out other projects in Elbasan, Shkoder and LAC.

We painted a school, roofed a play area in an orphanage, installed a well & large power generator . We applied torch on felt to a roof for a family in Shkoder. Installed toilets and a food servery in Tirana. Put a new roof on 2 buildings in Shkoder. Installed a new roof to a water boiler








In 2015 heart To Hand sent funding to Bishop John Ryan from Holycross Co Tipperary who has spent most of his career teaching and helping the people of Ungweru , Malawi. He got to work straight away and put in the foundations . More funding was sent out and in no time the school was up. Fr John was ordained a Bishop in Malawi in Sept 2016 Fr Celsus Tierney was present for the ordination. Fr Celsus is a volunteer with heart to hand and was delighted to see the finished school. School in Ungweru Malawi helps children with nutrition as they receive a meal each day . For some this is their only meal.



In 2017 volunteers travelled to Albania to install new roofs on houses, carry out essential repairs, install new electrical wiring and new plumbing. Materials were purchased in Albania and it was the first year we did not send a lorry out with building materials. Every year we sent 2 articulated lorries loaded with materials.





In 2017 we took the short journey to Mendicity in Dublin to construct a workshop for the homeless day residents where they make their arts and crafts. We installed a toilet and canopies over the doors . It was officially opened on 15th May 2017 by Lord Mayor of Dublin Mr Brendan Carr who presented Kieran Byrne with a handmade window flower box made by one of the residents.

#### A look back at some of our building projects in Albania

In 2018 it was back to Albania with 19 Volunteers to convert a large basement into a homeless shelter and soup kitchen in Tirana . The basement was divided into 3 sections , Accommodation, Kitchen and toilets and the children's room. We had TY ladies from Tipperary who were tasked with providing a room for children who would be staying in the shelter. They did an amazing job.

In Bushat a second team were working on houses where they installed new roofs, installed fitted kitchens, new electrical wiring and much more.











Then pictures above show some of the works in the children's room, the kitchen and the bed rooms. This basement was in poor condition when we arrived as water had been getting in over the years. Our first job was to fix the water getting in and install a pump to get it out. After several hours the source of the water was identified and the plan was put in place to fit it. This allowed us to dry out the floor and get working on the partitions and other works.



# Morgan Sharpe

As we looked back at the building projects we cannot forget the work of Morgan Sharpe who was sectary of Heart To Hand for a several years. There was no email, facebook, or social media for Morgan to spread the news of Heart To Hand, it was all done through letters! Newspaper articles, and long hours of hard work preparing letters for people who donated, sending thank you letters, making videos of the work and countless fundraising efforts to help keep the charity going and keep the building projects on track.
